MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

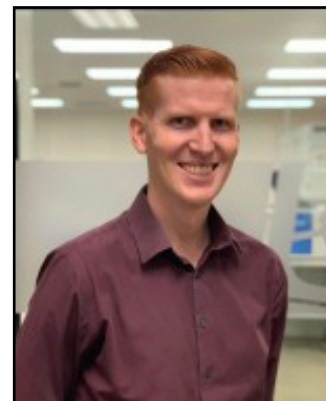

1) Where is your hometown?

4) How long have you been in the personal care industry?

Course Summary

This will be a two-day overview course on fundamental surfactant, emulsion, and polymer science required for direct practical applications in formulation design. The course will develop the fundamental understanding of the physico-chemical properties of surfactants, emulsions, and polymers that can impact the performance criteria (e.g. stability, foaming, cleansing, rheology etc.) of cosmetic and consumer products.

- In addition to the live instruction and Q&A, attendees will also have access to a full replay of the course for two weeks following the live course dates.

Who Should Attend

This course will be of interest and value to scientists, formulators, supervisors, and managers engaged in development, formulation, production, analytical characterization of personal care and consumer products that require a good working knowledge of fundamentals of surfactant, emulsion, and polymer science.

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REGULATORY UPDATES

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EU

Impending Ingredient Bans:

• **Lilial** - This ingredient, a fragrance component, will be banned in all products starting March 1, 2022. That means products containing this ingredient must be removed from store shelves and cannot be sold at all starting March 1, 2022.

• **Hair Dye Ingredient Ban/Restrictions** - On Nov. 12, 2020, the EU published a new regulation banning certain hair dyes from hair and eyelash products by adding them to Annex II of the Cosmetic regulations (Commission Regulation (EU) 2020/1683).

- 1,2,4-Trihydroxybenzene (CAS - 533-73-3)
- 6-amino-m-cresol (CAS - 2835-98-5)
- 4-Amino-2-Nitrodiphenylamine-2'-Carboxylic Acid (CAS - 117907-43-4)

After Sept. 3, 2021, those ingredients can no longer be shipped into the EU. On June 3, 2022, products containing those colorants must be off the market.

US

CLASS ACTIONS

• **Martha Stewart Pet Products** - (Filed 3/4/21 in US District Court of NY) Martha Stewart's Pet product names contain the word "Natural" and plaintiff alleges that claim is misleading since the products contain non-natural, synthetic ingredients. Because the plaintiffs paid more for Martha Stewarts products because they were thought to be natural, plaintiffs are seeking damages in the amount of the premium prices paid for the products. Synthetic ingredients that were called out were Glycerin, DMDM Hydantoin, Cetearyl Alcohol, Hydroxyethylcellulose, Stearic Acid, Cetyl Alcohol, Tocopheryl Acetate, Potassium Sorbate, Sodium Benzoate, Polysorbate 20, Methylisothiazolinone, and Butylene Glycol.

VIRGINIA

• **Animal Testing Ban** - Virginia became the 4th US state to ban animal tested products. It mimics other state's bans, like California, and goes into effect January 1, 2022.

CALIFORNIA

• **CARB ENFORCEMENT** - Walmart was fined over \$400,000 for selling hair finishing sprays and automotive windshield wiper fluid that violated the regulatory levels of VOCs allowed in those types of products. CARB said that Walmart released approximately 30 tons of excessive VOC emissions from the hair finishing spray which was responsible for the majority of the fine.



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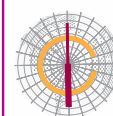
